the culture, but there's a big difference between talking about changing culture and actually changing the culture. At Zappo's the most fundamental piece of their culture is their core values. That's true of any organization, because the core values should drive behavior for everyone in the organization. Unlike most places I visit, at Zappo's the core values were in your face

everywhere. I mean literally EVERYWHERE. They are constant reminders to everyone about what the company stands for. In most places, you see the values on one poster somewhere or only on the website.

So there's the difference. If you want to change your culture or want people to live by the values you profess, you should make sure everyone knows them and that you hold people accountable to them...especially leaders. At Zappo's, they settled on 10 core values:

- 1. Deliver WOW Through Service
- 2. Embrace and Drive Change
- 3. Create Fun and a Little Weirdness
- 4. Be Adventurous, Creative, and Open-Minded
- 5. Pursue Growth and Learning
- 6. Build Open and Honest Relationships with Communication
- 7. Build a Positive Team and Family Spirit
- 8. Do More with Less
- 9. Be Passionate and Determined
- 10. Be Humble

If these were just a list of things on a boardroom wall, I'd say they were pretty hokie. But they aren't. Like I said, they are everywhere; on shot glasses, in graffiti, on signs, in break rooms, on machines, on tee-shirts, on the floor...everywhere. But they also have the structure to support them. They aren't' perfect, but who is. Go check them out yourself. They offer free tours of their facilities, and offer extra time with managers for small fees. Go and See!

After ruminating about this for a few months, and after hearing from a couple of folks, we've decided to offer our Lean Systems Certification Series in a public workshop starting in August.


